ERECT 70,000 SIGNS ON RECORD SCHEDULE

HARRISBURG.—Erection of 70,000 highway route markers six hours ahead of schedule and the entire job completed within forty-two hours recently was accomplished by the Pennsylvania Department of Highways. Markings now conform with the State and Federal system adopted by the department some months ago.
