The party was held at Romanoff's. Many stars attended but only a few remained when the incident occurred.

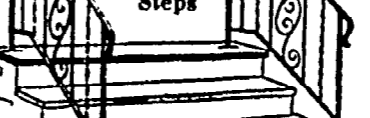

## DEATHS

SARANAC LAKE, N.Y. (AP)—John Lake, 56, announcer for the Amos and Andy radio show for many years, died Tuesday of tuberculosis. He had been under treatment 11 years.

NEW YORK (AP) — Leon A. Swirbul, 62, a founder of the Grumman Aircraft Engineering Corp. 31 years ago and its president since 1946, died Tuesday night of cancer. When Grumman was formed in 1929, Swirbul became executive vice president and general manager. He was awarded the Medal of Merit by President Harry S. Truman in 1946. Swirbul lived at Brookville, N.Y.

## Rare Disease Discovered In Penna.

HARRISBURG (AP) — Seven cases of a rare disease which causes mental retardation among children have been discovered in Pennsylvania in the first six months of testing.

The medical name for the disease is phenylketonuria but it is commonly called PKU.

Dr. Charles L. Wilbar, state health secretary, said today five of the cases were discovered by private physicians while two were found at Health Department clinics.

Wilbar said the figure is surprisingly large, since only a small percentage of the 250,000 infants born in Pennsylvania each year are tested for the disease. He added that about one per cent of all institutionalized mental defectives, or 122 individuals, have PKU. The disease is detectable by a simple urine test, Wilbar said. It is caused by an infant's inability to change a protein, found in ordinary milk, into nourishment.

PKU can be controlled through use of an expensive, scientifically prepared diet. The Health Department, Wilbar said, has funds to assist families where the medical care and special diet create a hardship. The department recommends continuation of the diet until the child reaches school age.
