Notes for James Albert Fleming:

On September 17, 1898, the regiment was granted a thirty days' furlough, and each company was directed to proceed to its home station. The headquarters of the regiment were established in Altoona, Pa. After the expiration of the furlough, ten days were given for muster out, and this time was afterwards increased an additional twenty days to give the regiment an opportunity to participate in the Peace Jubilee at Philadelphia, on October 27, 1898. The regiment was finally mustered out November 7, 1898.

James Campbell, son of Alexander, was born in 1794 in, and died 28 March 1858 in Armstrong Township, Indiana County, Penn. He married Margaret Craig 15 March 1826, the daughter of William Craig and Mary Gamble. James fought in the War of 1812 in the Army Infantry, 2nd Brigade, 2nd Division, in the Bucks County Militia as a Private from 1812 to 1814. It is still under research consideration whether or not the Campbell family first settled in Bucks County. Both Margaret and James were members of the West Union United Presbyterian Church located near Parkwood, PA; they are both buried in the West Union Cemetery. James and Margaret had seven children: Ann Jane, Margaret, William, Mary, Alexander Samuel, James Jr., and John Otis.

Margaret Craig, born 10 February 1795 and who died 27 October 1884 in Armstrong Township, PA. Margaret came to the United States from Ireland with her parents, in 1825. She married James Campbell, the son of Alexander Campbell and Margaret Johnston, 15 March 1826. Margaret is listed in the 1880 Census Record as living with her son, Alexander S Campbell and his family. Her obituary appears in the Indiana Times on October 29, 1884 reporting that Margaret Campbell died October 27, 1884 at the residence of her son, A S Campbell on the Old Homestead near Parkwood, PA aged about 89 years 7 months and 22 days. James and Margaret were members of the West Union located near Parkwood, in Armstrong Township, Indiana Co. They are both buried in the West Union UP emetry..

The deceased was a leading citizen of the neighborhood and served as a member of the school board and held many other offices of trust. He is survived by his wife, the former Elizabeth Harbison, and the following children: William, Elizabeth, and Tillie, all residing at home. He was a

member and ruling elder of the West Union Pres. Church. The funeral services were held on Saturday, forenoon at his late home. His pastor, Rev Ralston, officiated, interment following the church cemetery.

JOHN OTIS CAMPBELL

(1840-1929)

John Otis Campbell, aged over 89 years, who died at his home in Shelocta on Saturday, was one of the substantial citizens of that section of the county, where he had resided all his life. The deceased, who was a son of James and Margaret (Craig) Campbell, was born August 3, 1840, in Armstrong Township. He resided during the greater part of his life near Parkwood, where he was engaged in farming during his active years. He served as a member of Company A, 78th Regiment, PA Volunteers, during the Civil War, and was the last surviving veteran of the conflict in Shelocta and Armstrong Township. He was a lifelong member of the Shelocta United Presbyterian Church and his many fine traits of character won for him the admiration and respect of the community. The funeral services were conducted in the Curry Run Presbyterian Church, near Shelocta by his pastor, Rev. R. V. E. Wright, and interment followed in the Shelocta UP church cemetery. Notes for William Creaque:

William Craig was a Presbyterian Ulster Scott, his fore bearers coming to Northern Ireland from the Scottish Lowlands...all children were born in Northern Ireland. William and Mary emigrated to the United States between 1820 and 1826 settling in Armstrong Twp., Indiana Co., PA. William Craig purchased 322 1/4 acres of land in Armstrong Twp., from Anthony and Margaret Calwell, the deed recorded in Indiana County on November 12, 1828 and witnessed by William's son, Hugh Craig as well as David Johnston, perhaps the husband of his Daughter, Ann.

William Craig first appears in Armstrong Twp., tax records in 1829 as William Creigh, paying \$1.38 tax for 232 acres of land and one cow. Hugh Creigh is listed as paying 33 cents tax for 100 acres of land.

William Craig last appears in the tax records in 1837 paying tax on 210 acres of land as well as two horses and two cows. The notation is crossed out with a "transfer to Hugh Craig" indicating that William Craig was by then dead.

(1) John Craig, born 18 May 1790 and he died 12 April 1830 in Allegheny County, PA. John married the former Elizabeth Liggett, born 12 August 1793 and who died 25 August 1876 in Steubenville, Ohio. John and Elizabeth came to America in 1822, with their two eldest children, Joseph and Hugh, first living in Herriottsville, Washington County, PA, but in the spring of 1828 they moved to Allegheny City which was on the north side of the Allegheny River, opposite to Pittsburgh. John was a stonemason by trade, while Elizabeth ran a grocery, which was located on the west side of Federal Street, in which her son, Joseph Craig, worked part time from an early age. Elizabeth purchased the ground on Diamond Street, and in a small frame building, she attended to the grocery business, in which she prospered very well. Elizabeth sold her interests to her son, Joseph in 1846. John and Elizabeth Craig had five children: Joseph, Hugh, John, and two daughters, names unknown and who died young. Both John and Elizabeth are buried in Union Dale Cemetery, near Pittsburgh.

Hugh Craig, born 12 August 1799 and died 26 May 1876 in Armstrong Township, PA. Hugh was the first to come to America, arriving between 1818 and 1819, first living and working near Pittsburgh, PA. He married Barbara Ramsey, the daughter of John Ramsey and Jane McFarland. Hugh was a tanner first, but later a farmer, and worked the family homestead of his father, William. Both Hugh and Margaret were members of the West Union Presbyterian Church, and both are buried in the church cemetery there. They had seven children, all born in Armstrong Township, PA: William, Jane, Mary, Ann Margaret, Hannah Elizabeth, John Ramsey, and Sarah.

William Creaque was born in Craig Head, Scotland about 1730. He was a Presbyterian Ulster Scot and he was reputed to be a soldier, which is one likely explanation for his migration to Ireland. William had at least two sons, Joseph and William. William Creaque was born about 1750 near Mullaughfarn, County Fermanagh, North Ireland and he died 25 December 1836 in Armstrong Township, Indiana County, PA. William married Mary Gamble, about 1787 in Ireland, and they had six children, all born in Ireland. Our Craig family emigrated from North Ireland in four different groups, all coming to western Pennsylvania, settling in the counties of Allegheny and Indiana. Please see the CRAIG HISTORY for a full narrative. The children of William and Mary Creaque were all most likely born in Lowerstown, which is located near the present day town of Irvinestown.
