February 17th, 1892 was a day long to be remembered in the home of James and Margaret Dean Anderson near Glade Mills, Butler County, PA. This was their Golden Wedding Day. The day was all that could be desired. The roads although somewhat icy were in such condition as to enable about 80 friends and neighbors with 7 children and 13 grandchildren together at this hospitable manse; no more brightly did the sun illumine the sky than did these familiar faces illumine the countenance of the aged couple as one by one they received the hearty congratulations of the guests. Soon after the hour of 11 AM, the guests were led to the dining room where they received a bountiful supply of such things as only those of good old descent can furnish. All having been amply refreshed; quietness was restored by the singing of an anthem by some of the guests; after prayer by the Pastor; a toast to the bride and groom was given by Rev. T. L. Scott returned missionary from India who had been associated with their daughter Emma Dean Anderson in the Jhelum Mission in India; this was responded to by Rev H. R. Park of West Union United Presbyterian Church in his usual spicy manner; Rev. W. S. McNeese gave a toast to the grandchildren; followed by a letter from a former pastor Rev. H. E. Lackey not being able to attend; a toast to the parents setting forth their noble Christian character; a "Prophecy" was the title of a paper from Rev S. M. Krohn, College Corner, Ohio son in law of host and hostess; then followed a few brief remarks by the Pastor; James and Margaret Dean Anderson were happy recipients of valuable gifts of gold, greenbacks and other useful gifts; Then followed a history of the family which brought forth much mirth from a former Pastor Rev I. T. Wright. Letters of regret were read from ones who were unable to attend. After singing last 2 verses of 72nd Psalm to tune of "Cornation" the guests were dismissed with the benediction. Another hand shake and a wish of many more pleasant days to come - the crowd dispersed feeling it had been a day well spent and never to be forgotten.

ADDITIONAL NOTES FOR WILLIAM ANDERSON: Migrated from Ireland in 1816, settled first in Ohio. William, Elizabeth and Margaret (Patterson) of Donegal, Ireland crossed the Atlantic Ocean in 6 weeks, landing in Philadelphia, PA on August 1, 1816. Three weeks later, John Anderson was born. Some say they went first to Ohio. They then located in Indiana County, PA near Taylorsville, PA. In 1820, he bought a patent of 800 acres near Stewartsville, later called Parkwood, PA. Their grandson, William C., a private killed in the Civil War Co. D 206 Reg. PA Vol. Infantry and was buried at Fortress Monroe, VA - son of John Anderson & Eliza Caldwell Anderson. Elizabeth kept many of the records for the early family. Much of what is recorded here is due to information she wrote down.

Following his marriage, Daniel Anderson bought more than 100 acres of woodland, two miles from Parkwood. With his wife, he started to clear the land and build a home. He lived there for 30 years, when he bought the farm on the Kittanning pike. Daniel resided here until his death. At the age of eighty-six (86) a picture was taken of him feeding his sheep.

Daniel was born on the old homestead farm of 800 acres. This tract was later divided into smaller farms and a portion of the land was devoted to a town site for the village of Parkwood, which was laid out for William Anderson by Thompson McCrea on New Year's day - 1848. The town that was the home of the famous Rebel prison in which so many Union soldiers suffered and died during the Civil War.

The above was taken from an old newspaper clipping sometime during 1938.

In 1773 in Indiana County, there was sold to Moses Hobson 315 acres of land for sixteen dollars and fifty-nine cents (\$ 16.59). Divisions were made from time to time in this acreage until today the original 315 acres comprise sections of many farms.

In 1838, a brick house was built thereon, and recently a centennial party was held to mark the passing of one hundred years in which this house has given service. The original patent granted in 1773 and signed by Governor McKean was read. The bricks for the home were baked in a kiln on the farm and wood cut and sawed on the sawmill situated on the neighboring farm - all this during the days of the "Indian menace".

Civil War Veteran - Co F, 74 Regiment - PA Volunteers - he was a private. The box carried by Thomas Anderson throughout the Civil War contained a lock of his daughter's hair. It was returned to his wife after his death. He should have been home. The war was over. In his last letter, he wrote that the war would soon be over. When received, it already was. Leona Bracken had the box and the letter. These

were passed on to Thelma Hayden. Copies of the letter are in the hands of Martha Anderson McShane. He probably died of dysentery. Thomas erected CALDWELL POTTERY about 1850. He hired 1 or 2 men. Caldwell got it in 1868 and had 5 to 8 men. McNees 2 to 4 men. The stoneware was grey - stone pumps and drainpipe were made here as well.[108018.GED]

He made coffins, a length of cornstock was the length of a body and a notch he had made in a stick fitted for the width of a body. He made flyers, spools, wheels for spindles for spinning yarn. Women walked or rode horseback to get spinning outfits repaired. Eliza wove blankets, sheeting, toweling. Celebrated 50th Wed Anniv with 127 guests. John fell down the steps at this celebration and the injuries lead to his death. Martha lived at home and helped with domestic work. Elizabeth lived at home - taught Sabbath School, charter member of Armstrong Grange # 1695. Mary - lived at home until her health failed. She kept many records of the early family which much information is given here.[108018.GED]

#### PREFACE

This information is from the Genealogical Center in Londonderry and the Public Records Office in Belfast, Northern Ireland. Records are not complete because many of the records were destroyed by fire when buildings were burned during the Irish uprisings of 1916 and 1922-23.

There were many Andersons and Logans who came from the lowlands of Scotland and settled in the northern part of Ireland. It is not certain but it appears that the earliest William Anderson that we have record of was a son of a John Anderson. There were many William and John Andersons in Northern Ireland. The Andersons were mostly Scot-Presbyterian in their faith. At the time of the emigration of William and Elizabeth Logan Anderson, their siblings, and later their parents, William and Mary Haggerty (Hegarty) Anderson, there was religious persecution in Ireland. All people were required to tithe to the Church of

Ireland (similar to Episcopal). Many people objected since they were not of that church. There may have been other reasons for the Andersons and others to come to America but that appears to be the main reason for leaving Ireland at time--1816.

Ireland is sub-divided into counties. The Andersons in question were settled in County Derry. Counties were sub-divided into Civil Parishes. The Andersons were from the parish of Aghadowey. The Civil Parishes were sub-divided into town lands. Town lands were like small townships. The Andersons were from Meave Manouger which had a little over 176 acres. About eighty acres of Meave Manouger was farmed by the Andersons. It is not known whether the Andersons owned the land or if they were tenant farmers. Quite often town lands were owned by companies. Some of the companies were very helpful to persecuted people and in many instances paid their passage to America.

Meave Manouger is recorded as Merchant Taylor's lands. It is in the southwest of the Parish of Aghadowey on the boundary of the Parish of Errigal and North of Shanlongford. The land rises from southeast to northwest from 350 to 396 feet. There is a hill and "two piles of rocks--" "Meave's Pointed rocks or pinnacles." Other derivations are "Maud's Hilly Land", and "The O'Connor's Plain".

There is a little crossroads village called Ringsend., It has a small post office« small store, a few houses, and a Presbyterian Church that dates to 1835. It is an offspring of the Killaig Presbyterian Church.

Meave Manouger today is mostly beautiful farmland of rolling hills with broad valleys of fields fenced with stone walls and hedge rows.

There are no Andersons living in the Meave Manouger area but there is a George Hegarty. He said the Hegartys came from farther North at Castle Rock. His people have only owned their farm a little over a hundred years.
